LOCATION

Hacienda Zuleta is located about 2 hours North East of Ecuador's capital, Quito. The roads between Quito and the Hacienda are a bit tricky to navigate, so most of our guests arrange for hired transportation to and from the Hacienda.

ACCOMMODATION

A presidential retreat opens its doors with 17 unique rooms to choose from, ideal for adventurers, honeymooners, and families alike.

The hacienda has 17 unique, beautifully appointed rooms, each with its own fireplace and queen-sized, king-sized, or twin beds.

We have three different types of room:

- Hacienda Junior Suite: four rooms of 30 m² with king-size bed, desk, two chairs, two sofa corner, fireplace, cupboard, two luggage racks.
- Hacienda Deluxe Room: nine rooms of 20 m² with king- or queen-size bed, desk, two chairs, cupboard, fireplace, two luggage racks.
- Hacienda Standard Room: four rooms of 12-15 m² with queen-size bed, desk, two chairs, fireplace, cupboard, luggage rack.
